

The image of the Good Shepherd shows us how the risen Christ brings us to life. It's the relationship between the shepherd and the sheep, one of mutual knowledge and love, that gives the shepherd authority. The shepherd's willingness to lay down his life for the sheep shows his love. First John illustrates what it means to lay down our lives for another by the example of sharing our wealth with any sister or brother in need. Today, Earth itself is in need—and we are being called to divest ourselves of habits and practices which impact and affect the biosystems that sustain life on our planet.

FIRST READING: 1 John 3:16-24

Jesus' death on our behalf is the clearest demonstration of divine love. This is the very love we share with others, not just through our words but especially through our deeds. In sharing such love we fulfill God's commandments.

We know love by this, that Jesus Christ laid down his life for us--and we ought to lay down our lives for one another. ¹⁷How does God's love abide in anyone who has the world's goods and sees a brother or sister in need and yet refuses help?

¹⁸Little children, let us love, not in word or speech, but in truth and action. ¹⁹And by this we will know that we are from the truth and will reassure our hearts before him ²⁰whenever our hearts condemn us; for God is greater than our hearts, and he knows everything. ²¹Beloved, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have boldness before God; ²²and we receive from him whatever we ask, because we obey his commandments and do what pleases him.

GOSPEL: John 10:11-18

In language that recalls the twenty-third psalm, Jesus describes himself as the shepherd who cares for his sheep. He is willing to die for them, and he is able to overcome death for them.

[Jesus said:] ¹¹ "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. ¹²The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away—and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. ¹³The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. ¹⁴I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, ¹⁵just as the Father knows me and I know the Father.

And I lay down my life for the sheep. ¹⁶I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. ¹⁷For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. ¹⁸No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it up again. I have received this command from my Father."

+ SACRAMENT OF HOLY BAPTISM +

The candidate, sponsor, and parents gather at the font as the congregation sings verses 1-2 of ELW #445. Pastor Kindem addresses the baptismal group and the congregation, on page 227, ELW.

P God, who is rich in mercy and love, gives us a new birth into a living hope through the sacrament of baptism. By water and the Word God delivers us from sin and death and raises us to new life in Jesus Christ. We are united with all the baptized in the one body of Christ, anointed with the gift of the Holy Spirit, and joined in God's mission for the life of the world.

PRESENTATION

- P Hilary, who do you present for baptism?
- S I present <u>Astrud Bernadette Gray</u> for baptism.

Pastor Kindem addresses the parents:

P Heidi and Jason, called by the Holy Spirit and trusting in the grace and love of God, do you desire to have your daughter baptized into Christ?

Response: We do.

- P As you bring Astrud to receive the gift of baptism, you are entrusted with gifts and responsibilities:
 - to live with her among God's faithful people,
 - to bring her to the word of God and the holy supper,
 - to teach her the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments,
 - to place in her hands the Holy Scriptures,
 - and to nurture her in faith and prayer, so that she may learn to trust God, proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace.

Do you promise to help your daughter grow in the Christian faith & life?

Response: We do.

P Hilary, do you promise to nurture this child in the Christian faith as you are empowered by God's Spirit, and to help her live in the covenant of baptism and in communion with the church?

Response: I do.

Pastor Kindem addresses the assembly:

P People of God, do you promise to support <u>Astrud</u> and to pray for her in her new life in Christ? If so, answer, "we do."

Response: We do.

RENUNCIATION OF EVIL AND PROFESSION OF FAITH

Pastor Kindem addresses the baptismal party and the congregation:

In baptism God's NO becomes our NO; and God's YES becomes our YES.

As we baptize today, and affirm our own baptisms,

I ask you to profess your faith in Christ, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church.

Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God,

the powers of this world that rebel against God,

and the ways of sin that draw you from God? If so, answer "I renounce them."

Response: I renounce them.

Addressing the whole assembly:

Do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord.

who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,

born of the virgin Mary,

suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried;

He descended into hell.

On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit? I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

Assistants pour water into the font during the thanksgiving.

- C Your waters are below us, around us, above us: our life is born in you. You are the fountain of resurrection.
- P Praise to you for your saving waters:
 Noah and the animals survive the flood, Hagar discovers your well.
 The Israelites escape through the sea, and they drink from your gushing rock.
 Naaman washes his leprosy away, and the Samaritan woman will never be thirsty again.
 At this font, holy God, we praise to you for the water of baptism and for your Word that saves us in this water. Breathe your Spirit into all who are gathered here and into all creation. Illumine our days. Enliven our bones. Dry our tears.

Wash away the sin within us, and drown the evil around us.

C Satisfy all our thirst with your living water, Jesus Christ, our Savior, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

 - the spirit of counsel and might,
 - the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord,
 - the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and forever.

SIGNING WITH THE CROSS AND ANOINTING

Astrud is anointed with oil and given the sign of the cross.

- P <u>Astrud</u>, child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever.
- C Amen.

PRESENTATION OF A CANDLE

The assisting minister presents a lighted candle to the newly baptized.

A Jesus said, I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will have the light of life.

Astrud is received by the community with acclamation.




INVITATION TO COMMUNION


- P The risen Christ is made known to us in the breaking of the bread. Come and eat at God's table.



THIS WEEK'S ACT FOR CREATION

Babies vs. Plastics. Babies and young children are especially susceptible to the bioaccumulation of microplastics. According to earthday.org, babies' typical behaviors, such as putting toys in their mouth,

chewing on objects, crawling, and spending up to 90% of their time indoors (where they play with plastic-based toys, wear plastic-coated diapers, and drink from plastic bottles in their plastic high chairs) mean that they ingest more microplastics than do adults. Beginning with Earth Day tomorrow, advocate for the health of our little ones by reducing their exposure to plastic as much as possible and by asking manufacturers and retailers of baby products to offer non-plastic alternatives.
